SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. RULES

- 1.1 This series will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*, the [Shadden Series Standing Rule](#), and the [2016-2017 Shadden Series Notice of Race](#).
- 1.2 Each entrant must meet the eligibility, entry and fee requirements as outlined in the [Notice of Race](#) for this regatta.
- 1.3 Sail number and crew changes must be approved by the Shadden Series Chairman, Mike Segerblom (mikesegeo@ussclb.org) and reported to the Race Committee (RC) before the first race.
- 1.4 In addition to the requirements of RRS 40 and its US Sailing Prescription, a condition of entry and participation in this regatta is the wearing of a US Coast Guard approved PFD, or a PFD approved by the country of the competitor's citizenship or residence, properly secured at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while removing or adding clothing. Wet suits, dry suits and inflatable PFDs do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy. All PFDs must be suitable for the competitor's weight. Violation of this provision will result in a penalty up to and including disqualification at the discretion of the Protest Committee. This changes RRS 40 and the Preamble to Part 4.
- 1.5 RRS 82 will not apply. Competitors must complete the Race Entry Agreement through online registration at the [Regatta Toolbox](#) or submit a CYC Race Entry form.
- 1.6 Each boat will be issued a supplemental sail number at Registration, which shall be affixed to the starboard side of the main sail above the top-most batten and no more than six (6) inches from the luff.
- 1.7 No later than the Warning Signal for a race, the RC may prohibit the use of spinnakers for that race by flying code flag "G" (yellow and blue vertical stripes) from the RC signal boat.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the notice board located on the deck of the Junior Sailing Center (Official Notice Board).

3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted no later than 1000 on race day.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole at the CYC Junior Sailing Center.
- 4.2 When the Answering Pennant (AP) is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than seventy-five (75) minutes" in the RRS Race Signals.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 There will be a Competitors' Meeting at 0930 on Sunday, October 8 at the pool patio adjacent to the Junior Sailing Center. There will be a Coach & Support Boat Meeting immediately following the Competitors' Meeting.
- 5.2 Five (5) races are scheduled. The Race Committee, at its discretion, may run fewer races.
- 5.3 The scheduled time for the Warning Signal for the first race is 1200. Subsequent races will start as soon as practicable after the finish of the prior race.
- 5.4 Code flag A displayed, with no sound, while boats are finishing means "No more racing today."

6. CLASS FLAG

The class flag will be the CFJ Class insignia on a white background.

7. RACE AREA

The racing area will be on Santa Monica Bay. The starting area will be approximately one (1) nautical mile northwest of the Marina del Rey breakwater.

8. MARKS

The marks are described on Attachment A.

9. COURSES

The courses are described on Attachment A.

10. CHECK-IN

Prior to the Warning Signal for the first race, when the RC signal boat displays code flag "L", each boat shall sail past her stern, hail her supplemental sail number and be recognized by the RC. Boats failing to check-in properly may be given a twenty percent (20%) scoring penalty for the first race of the day, assessed without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

11. THE START

11.1 The starting line will be between the staff of an orange and white checkered flag on the markset boat **S** at its port end and the staff of an orange and white checkered flag on the RC signal boat at its starboard end (See Attachment A).

11.2 A boat that starts more than five (5) minutes after her assigned starting time shall be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1, A4.1 and A5.

11.3 Boats that are subject to RRS 29.1 – *Individual Recall* – at their Starting Signal (*i.e.*, must comply with RRS 29.1 or 30.1) may be hailed by supplemental sail number via loudhailer. If code flag "I" and/or "Z" has been displayed, the RC may attempt to hail the supplemental sail number(s) of boats on the course side of the starting line or its extension **during the minute before** the starting signal. This changes RRS 41.

11.4 Failure of the RC to hail, failure of the amplification system, timeliness or order of hail, or failure of a competitor to hear shall not be considered grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

12. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the RC will move the next mark from its original position to the new position. The change will be signaled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the mark may not yet be in position. See RRS 33.

13. THE FINISH

13.1 The finishing line will be between an orange and white checkered flag on the signal boat at the port end, and Mark **F** at the starboard end (see Attachment A).

13.2 Competitors are reminded that RRS 24.1 prohibits a boat that has finished from interfering with boats still racing.

14. PENALTY SYSTEM

14.1 Penalties for breaking **SI 17** may be less than disqualification if the Protest Committee so decides.

14.2 Appendix P, Special Procedures for RRS 42, applies with the following changes: in P2.1 – First Penalty, the word "first" is deleted; P2.2 and P2.3 are deleted.

14.3 In addition to 14.2, the Jury will also observe racing for other than RRS 42 infringements. When the Jury sees an infringement, they will make one sound signal. This means that the Jury has seen a protest-able situation and one or more competitors should do penalty turns. No sail number will be hailed. The Jury may protest boat(s) that fail to take penalty turns.

14.4 Action or no action by the Jury under **SI 14** shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.

14.5 On the water jury boats will be identified by code flag "J".

14.6 RRS 60.1(a) is changed to prohibit a boat from protesting another boat for an alleged breach of any class rule other than class equipment measurement rules.

15. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

15.1 A breach of **SI 10**, **17** and **19** will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

15.2 Protests shall be filed on the deck of the Junior Sailing Center no later than forty-five (45) minutes after the RC signal boat has docked (Protest Time Limit), which time will be posted on Official Notice Board. Protest forms will be available on the deck of the Junior Sailing Center.

15.3 Scoring inquires must be filed within the Protest Time Limit or 30 minutes after the preliminary results are posted, whichever is later.

15.4 RRS 62.2 (Redress) is modified as follows:

The first line has been changed to read: "The request shall be in writing and be delivered to the deck of the Junior Sailing Center no later than the Protest Time Limit or thirty (30) minutes after the incident, whichever is later."

15.5 No later than fifteen (15) minutes after the RC signal boat docks, the RC will post a list of boats that have received a scoring penalty per RRS A5 or have been penalized under **SI 10** or **SI 11.2**. The deadline for a request for redress based on this list will be the Protest Time Limit.

15.6 RRS 66 (Reopening a Hearing) is changed so that the time limit for delivering a request to reopen a hearing is the Protest Time Limit or thirty (30) minutes after the decision is announced, whichever is later.

- 15.7 No later than fifteen (15) minutes after the Protest Time Limit, a notice of filed protests and requests for redress will be posted on the Official Notice Board. This will constitute notice to all parties to a hearing under RRS 63.2.
- 15.8 Hearings will be held in the Gallery Room, downstairs in the CYC clubhouse. Representatives of boats who are parties to a hearing and their witnesses shall remain on call in the vicinity of the Gallery Room.
- 15.9 Protests and requests for redress will be heard in the approximate order of receipt as soon as possible.

16. SCORING

- 16.1 All race scores will count.
- 16.2 One (1) race must be completed to constitute a regatta.

17. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 17.1 Each competitor that launches their boat from CYC must sign out prior to leaving the dock and sign in upon return. Each competitor not launching from CYC shall notify Regatta Chair, Hunter Gorog at (310) 499-8601, to confirm that they have returned to the dock.
- 17.2 A boat that withdraws from the race prior to finishing shall notify the RC either before leaving the Racing Area or as soon as practicable after arriving ashore.

18. SAFETY AND ADULT RESPONSIBILITY

- 18.1 Each competitor under eighteen (18) shall submit a [CYC Parental Consent Form](#), signed by their parent or guardian, which indicates the parent or adult representative ("designated adult") that will be responsible for the competitor throughout the event.
- 18.2 It is solely the responsibility of the designated adult to decide if the competitor should sail in the weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event. Additionally, the designated adult shall accept full responsibility for all actions of the competitor during any activity related to the event. This includes on-shore activities before, during, and after the regatta.
- 18.3 Competitors over the age of eighteen (18) are responsible for their own actions, and for the decision to sail in weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event.

19. COACH / SUPPORT BOATS

- 19.1 The skipper of each coach/support boat is required to attend the Competitors' Meeting and must register with the RC immediately following that meeting.
- 19.2 Only coach/support boats that have registered with the RC and prominently display identification provided by the RC will be allowed in the racing area. There will be a refundable deposit of \$20 required for each identification flag.
- 19.3 All coach/support boats must carry a VHF radio, monitor a VHF radio and check in with the RC at the starting area via VHF radio on channel 68. All individuals on such registered boats are required to wear PFDs.
- 19.4 Coach/support boats shall not display distinctive markings or signaling apparatus, or any flags other than their ensign and the flags provided by the RC while any boats are racing.
- 19.5 No coach/support boat may be within one hundred (100) yards of the course boundaries or have communication with a competitor between the first warning signal for a race and the time that the competitor has finished that race. However, such boats may enter the race area at the direction of the RC to assist a competitor or after an abandonment or postponement until a new warning signal has been made. This changes RRS 41.
- 19.6 Coach/support boats shall neither create wakes nor otherwise interfere with competitors.
- 19.7 After racing, competing boats will have priority over coach/support boats at the hoist.
- 19.8 A violation of **SI 19** may result in any penalty that the Protest Committee deems appropriate, up to and including the disqualification of the associated competitor(s) from the regatta. Additionally, upon receiving a report, the RC may take other disciplinary action against the registered support personnel.

20. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at CYC on the front lawn adjacent to the main clubhouse.

21. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

8. MARKS (continued)

- 8.1. Marks **W** and **Ls/Lp** will be orange inflatable tetrahedrons.
- 8.2. Mark **O** will be a flag buoy.
- 8.3. Mark **S** will be the staff of an orange and white checkered flag on the markset boat
- 8.4. Mark **F** will be the staff of an orange and white checkered flag buoy.

9. COURSES (continued)

- 9.1. An offset mark (Mark **O**) will be used in conjunction with Mark **W**. The offset mark will be placed at approximately a right angle to the weather leg.
- 9.2. Marks **W** and **O** shall be left to port.
- 9.3. Mark **Ls/Lp** is a gate. In the event only one leeward mark is on station, that mark shall be rounded to port.
- 9.4. Courses will be signaled by numeral placards from the RC signal boat as shown below:

Courses	
1	Start – W – O - Finish
2	Start – W – O – Ls/Lp - Finish
3	Start – W – O – Ls/Lp – W – O - Finish
4	Start – W – O – Ls/Lp – W – O – Ls/Lp - Finish
