GENERAL INFORMATION

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) and by the <u>2018 International</u> Optimist Class Rules.
- 1.2 RRS 82 will not apply.
- 1.3 A condition of entry and participation in this regatta is the wearing of a U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejacket or, for international sailors only, a lifejacket approved by their country's corresponding authority, properly secured at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while removing or adding clothing. All lifejackets must be suitable for the competitor's weight. Wet suits, dry suits, and inflatable lifejackets do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy. These changes are added to rule 40, and the Preamble to Part 4 will not apply to rule 40. [DP]
- 1.4 RRS, Appendix D, Team Racing Rules, will apply, as modified by the Sailing Instructions.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 This regatta is open to invited teams sailing International Optimist Dinghy class boats. Nine (9) teams will be invited.
- 2.2 Section 6.1, Eligibility, of the U.S. Optimist Dinghy Association (USODA) Conditions will apply.
- 2.3 To be considered for an invitation, potential teams should contact the Regatta Chair (contact information in NoR 16) no later than August 1.
- 2.4 Invited teams must accept their invitation by August 30 in order to be eligible to compete.
- 2.5 Invited teams may enter their boat by having their parent or guardian complete online registration at the <u>Sanguinetti Dinghy Regatta</u> webpage by August 30, and pay all fees by 0930 on Saturday, September 29.
- 2.6 Each competitor must submit a completed <u>CYC Parental Consent Form and Waiver</u>, signed by a parent or guardian. This can be faxed to 310.822.3658, scanned and emailed to the Regatta Chair (contact information in NoR 16) or submitted at Check-in.
- 2.7 Only entries that have completed Check-in by 0930 on Saturday, September 29 will be eligible to race. Late Check-in may be allowed only with the approval of the Regatta Chair.

3. CHECK-IN

- 3.1 Check-in will be on the CYC pool patio between 0800 and 0930 on Saturday, September 29.
- 3.2 Check-in includes completing online registration, paying all fees, and submitting a completed CYC Parental Consent Form and Waiver per NoR 2.5.

4. FEES

The entry fee is \$200 per team (four or five persons).

5. REGATTA FORMAT

This is an invitational, umpired, Team Race event with a 4 vs. 4 format.

Two complete round-robins are scheduled. The Race Committee (RC), at its discretion, may run fewer races.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be posted at the <u>Sanguinetti Dinghy Regatta</u> webpage by Wednesday, September 26 and printed copies will be available at Check-in only upon request. Course Charts will be available at Check-in.

8. VENUE

The racing area will be inside Marina del Rey Harbor. Parents and friends are encouraged to spectate from the adjacent docks and Burton Chace Park.

9. THE COURSES

The courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions.

10. SCORING

Team Racing Scoring, Appendix D3 and D4 will apply.

11. SAFETY

- 11.1 Each competitor shall have a whistle attached to their PFD at all times while on the water.
- 11.2 Each boat shall have a secure loop in the end of its bow line.
- 11.3 Each skipper who launches their boat from CYC must sign-out prior to leaving the dock and sign-in upon return. Each skipper not launching from CYC, each day, shall notify the Regatta Chair before leaving their dock and, following the final race of each day, shall notify the Regatta Chair as soon as practical to confirm they have returned to their dock. [DP] (See NoR 16 for Regatta Chair contact information.)

12. DESIGNATED ADULT

- 12.1 An adult (parent, guardian or designated adult) is responsible for the safety of each competitor. It is solely the responsibility of this adult to decide if the competitor should sail in the weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event. The adult supervising the competitor is ultimately responsible for the risks. Additionally, this designated adult shall accept full responsibility for all actions of the competitor during any activity related to the event. This includes onshore activities before, during, and after the regatta.
- Any parent or guardian not personally attending any part of the event shall submit a CYC Parental Consent Form and Waiver, indicating the name and contact information for the adult who shall be on-site, and who is authorized and designated to be responsible for their child during this event per NoR 12.1.

13. COACH / SUPPORT BOATS

- 13.1 Coach/support boats must register with the RC and prominently display an identification flag provided by the RC. Only registered coach/support boats will be allowed in the racing area. There will be a refundable deposit of \$20 required for each identification flag, payable on-site on September 29. [DP]
- 13.2 All coach/support boats must carry and monitor a VHF radio. All individuals on such registered boats are required to wear PFDs. [DP]
- 13.3 The conduct of registered coach/support boats, all other support boats, and support persons, will be governed by the Sailing Instructions.
- 13.4 Coach/support and spectator boats shall remain in the water from the time they are launched at CYC until the completion of the regatta. [DP]
- 13.5 Competitors who wish to keep coach/support boats at CYC must make arrangements with the Dockmaster for use of the hoist, trailer storage and in-the-water berthing. Contact CYC Dockmaster, Evan Davis at evan.davis@calyachtclub.net or at 310.823.4567

14. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded after racing on Sunday to the top three finishing teams.

15. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. By participating in this regatta, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this regatta to the fullest extent permitted by law.
