GENERAL INFORMATION

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1 This series will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 PHRF of Southern California (PHRF SoCal) <u>Class Rules</u> will be in effect for handicap boats.
- 1.3 RRS 82 will not apply.
- 1.4 While racing, all boats shall
 - (a) have official sail numbers on their mainsail and any overlapping headsails [DP], and
 - (b) display the class flag assigned for their class [DP].

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 This series is open to keelboats with a maximum length overall of fifty-five (55) feet that have a valid PHRF SoCal Rating Certificate and to Martin 242 Class boats. Other one-design classes will be considered upon application to the Series Chairs.
- 2.2 Each boat must:
 - (a) if competing in the Racing Division, have a valid PHRF SoCal Regular or Temporary BUOY Rating not to exceed 186, or fulfill the eligibility requirements of the one-design class in which she competes;
 - (b) if competing in the Cruising Division, have a valid PHRF SoCal Corinthian BUOY Rating. Keelboats with a valid PHRF SoCal Regular or Temporary BUOY rating may petition the Cruising Coordinator for inclusion in the Cruising Division. See NoR 12 for contact information.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter a single race or the series by completing <u>online registration</u> at the <u>Sunset Series</u> webpage or submitting a <u>CYC Race Entry</u> at the CYC front desk, and paying all fees prior to 1730 on the day of the race. An entry is not complete until payment is received.
- 2.4 For competitors under the age of 18, entries must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.

3. FEES

The entry fee is \$16 per race (\$285 for the series) for US Sailing members with proof of membership, \$18 per race (\$320 for the series) for non-members.

4. CLASSES / CLASS FLAGS

- 4.1 There will be two divisions, Racing and Cruising, with classes established in each division at the discretion of the OA.
- 4.2 Class assignments, with starting times and class flags for each class, will be posted on the <u>Sunset Series</u> webpage by 1900 on Wednesday, April 11.

5. SCHEDULE

One race is scheduled for each Wednesday night from April 18 to September 5, excluding July 4. The total number of scheduled races is 20. If one or more races are not held due to weather or other conditions, then the total number of races will be reduced accordingly.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be posted on the <u>Sunset Series</u> webpage by 1900 on Wednesday, April 11.

7. VENUE / COURSES

The racing area will be on Santa Monica Bay and inside Marina del Rey Harbor. Courses will start outside the Harbor at MDR Mark SS (see Marina del Rey Course Chart 17), go to a windward mark, and then finish inside the Harbor.

8. SCORING

- Handicap boats will be scored using their valid PHRF SoCal Area B BUOY ratings. Boats from outside Area B will have Area B adjustments applied as available. For boats that have multiple valid ratings, should a boat use more than one rating she shall be considered as a different boat for each rating.
- 8.2 Non-spinnaker offsets will not be used in the Racing Division.
- A boat assigned to the Cruising A Class may declare to be "non-spinnaker" by notifying the Race Committee (RC) in writing (email acceptable), after which the rating under which she is competing will be adjusted by +9 sec/mi. A Cruising A Class boat may change the declaration once during the series (spinnaker to non-spinnaker or *vice versa*) by notifying the RC in writing (email acceptable) before sailing with the changed configuration.
- 8.4 Boats assigned to the Cruising B Class are not allowed to fly a spinnaker. Non-spinnaker offsets will not be used.
- 8.5 Series scoring will be done using the "Sunset Scoring System", a weighted, modified high-point system that factors in the size of classes. A boat's series score for both Class and Division (Racing or Cruising) scoring will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst scores as follows: after 7-10 races, exclude 1 score; after 11-14 races, exclude 2 scores; and, after 15+ races, exclude 3 scores.

9. RADIO COMMUNICATION

While on the water, the RC may communicate with competing boats via VHF radio, including starting penalties.

10. PRIZES

- Trophies for individual races will be given out at CYC as soon as possible after each race. Trophies for the series (Class and Division) will be awarded after the final race on September 5. The number of trophies for a class will be based on the number of starters in the race as follows: 2-4 boats = 1 trophy; 5-7 boats = 2 trophies; 8-10 boats = 3 trophies; 11-13 boats = 4 trophies; 14+ boats = 5 trophies.
