# **NOTICE OF RACE**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

# 1. RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 PHRF of Southern California (PHRF SoCal) Class Rules will be in effect for handicap boats.
- 1.3 US Sailing Prescription RRS 82 will not apply.

# 2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 This regatta is open to handicap boats that have a valid PHRF SoCal Rating Certificate and to one-design keelboats. Handicap boats must compete in a W/L rated configuration between 0 and 186. Boats outside this range may petition the OA for inclusion.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing online registration at the <u>Summer Regatta</u> webpage and paying all fees prior to 1800 on Friday, August 16. Entries submitted after that time may be accepted only with the approval of the Regatta Chair and will be charged a \$10 late fee. Star class only: please include the names of both skipper and crew.

#### CLASSES

- 3.1 One-design keelboats must have a minimum of three (3) paid entries prior to the entry deadline to establish a class. Those with the same PHRF SoCal Area B W/L rating may be combined to establish a Level Rating class. Those that do not establish a class may compete in the PHRF Racing Division, if they are in compliance with the handicap boat requirements per NoR 2.1.
- 3.2 Handicap boats will compete in either a PHRF Racing or a PHRF Cruising Division and must have a minimum of three (3) paid entries prior to the entry deadline to establish a Division. A boat whose Rating Certificate has an "Active" Boat Configuration Adjustment Status will be assigned to the Cruising Division; a boat whose Status is not "Active" may petition the OA for inclusion in that Division. All other handicap boats will be assigned to the Racing Division.
- 3.3 Handicap classes will be established within each Division at the discretion of the OA based on entries received by the entry deadline.
- 3.4 Classes with fewer than five (5) entries may have their starts combined, though they may be scored separately.
- 3.5 Classes, class flags, and order of starts for the first race will be posted on the bulletin board outside the main entrance to CYC (Official Notice Board) and at the Summer Regatta webpage by 1900, Friday, August 16.

#### 4. FEES

The entry fee is \$30 for members of US Sailing with proof of membership, \$35 for non-members, for entries received by Wednesday, August 7. Thereafter, until the entry deadline, the entry fee is \$40 for US Sailing members, \$45 for non-members.

# 5. SCHEDULE

Up to four (4) races are scheduled. The Race Committee (RC), at its discretion, may run fewer races for any or all classes.

#### 6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be posted at the Summer Regatta webpage by Wednesday, August 14.

#### 7. VENUE

The racing area will be on Santa Monica Bay, approximately one (1) nautical mile northwest of the Marina del Rey breakwater.

#### 8. THE COURSES

Courses will be a windward / leeward format.

#### SCORING

- 9.1 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 9.2 One (1) race must be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 9.3 Handicap boats will be scored using their valid PHRF SoCal Area B W/L Ratings. Boats from outside of Area B will have Area B adjustments applied as available. Non-spinnaker offsets are authorized for use in the Cruising Division only.

# 10. RADIO COMMUNICATION

While on the water, the RC may communicate with competing boats via VHF radio, including starting penalties.

#### 11. PRIZES

Trophies will be awarded after racing based on the number of entries in each class.

### 12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in this event entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
