NOTICE OF RACE

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. RULES

- 1.1 This event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS), by the current <u>Club FJ Class Association</u> (<u>CFJCA</u>) <u>Rules</u>, by the <u>Shadden Standing Rule</u>, and by the 2022-2023 Shadden Perpetual Trophy Series Notice of Race. The Series NoR will be posted at SCYYRA when it is issued.
- 1.2 [DP] A condition of entry and participation in this event is the wearing of a U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejacket or, for international sailors only, a lifejacket approved by their country's corresponding authority, properly secured at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while removing or adding clothing. All lifejackets must be suitable for the competitor's weight. Wet suits, dry suits, and inflatable lifejackets do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy. These changes are added to RRS 40, and the Preamble to Part 4 will not apply to RRS 40.
- 1.3 US Sailing Prescription RRS 81 does not apply. This changes the Shadden Perpetual Trophy Series NoR.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted by Wednesday, September 28 on the Official Notice Board. Course Charts will be available at Check-in.

3. COMMUNICATION

The Official Notice Board is the <u>Shadden Series #2</u> webpage. Notices may also be posted on the bulletin board outside the main entrance to the CYC clubhouse.

4. IDPI CODE OF CONDUCT

- 4.1 Each coach is responsible for ensuring that all members of their team, support personnel and their guests abide by the laws, public health orders, and guidance from government authorities and/or CYC applicable to sailing and/or shore side activities in effect during the event to minimize potential exposure to or transmission of the COVID-19 virus.
- 4.2 Failure to comply with NoR 4.1 may be misconduct.
- 4.3 Reasonable actions by event officials and CYC to implement COVID-19 guidance, protocols or legislation, even if they later prove to have been unnecessary, are not improper actions or omissions.

5. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 5.1 This event is open to Club FJ class boats that meet CFJCA rules.
- 5.2 Eligible skippers may enter their boat by completing online registration at the Shadden #2 webpage and paying all fees by the entry deadline of 1800 on Saturday, October 1. Entries submitted after that time may be accepted only with the approval of the Event Chair and will be charged a \$10 late fee.
- 5.3 Each competitor under the age of eighteen (18) must submit a completed <u>CYC Parental Consent Form and Waiver</u>, signed by a parent or guardian. This form can be scanned and emailed to the Event Chair (contact information in NoR 17) or submitted at Check-in.
- 5.4 Only entries that have completed Check-in by 0930 on Sunday, October 2 are eligible to race. Late Check-in may be allowed only with the approval of the Event Chair.

6. CHECK-IN

- 6.1 Check-in is on the CYC pool patio adjacent to the Jr. Sailing Center between 0830 and 0930 on Sunday, October 2.
- 6.2 To complete Check-in, each entrant shall have met all eligibility and entry requirements, paid all fees and submitted a completed CYC Parental Consent Form and Waiver per NoR 5.3.

7. FEES

The entry fee is \$50 for entries received by Wednesday, September 21. Thereafter, until the entry deadline, the entry fee is \$60. A portion of the entry fee goes to SCYYRA for sanctioning the series.

Five (5) races are scheduled. The Race Committee, at its discretion, may run fewer races.

9. VENUE

The starting area is on Santa Monica Bay approximately one (1) nautical mile northwest of the Marina del Rey breakwater.

10. THE COURSES

The courses are primarily windward/leeward with some reaching legs if conditions warrant.

11. SCORING

- 11.1 One (1) race must be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.2 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 11.3 The Shadden Series will be scored per the Shadden Perpetual Trophy Series Notice of Race.

12. SAFETY

[DP] Each skipper who launches their boat from CYC must sign-out prior to leaving the dock and sign-in upon return. Each skipper not launching from CYC shall notify the Event Chair before leaving their dock and, following the final race of the day, shall notify the Event Chair as soon as practical to confirm they have returned to their dock. (See NoR 17 for Event Chair contact information).

13. DESIGNATED ADULT

- 13.1 An adult (parent, guardian or designated adult) is responsible for the safety of each competitor under the age of eighteen (18). It is solely the responsibility of this adult to decide if the competitor should sail in the weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event. The adult supervising the competitor is ultimately responsible for the risks. Additionally, this designated adult shall accept full responsibility for all actions of the competitor during any activity related to the event. This includes onshore activities before, during, and after the event.
- 13.2 [DP] Each competitor under the age of eighteen (18) shall provide a completed <u>CYC Parental Consent Form and Waiver</u>, signed by a parent or guardian, indicating the name and contact information for the adult who shall be on-site, and who is authorized and designated to be responsible for that competitor during this event per NoR 5.3 and 13.1.
- 13.3 Competitors who are eighteen (18) years or older are responsible for their own actions, and for the decision to sail in weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event.

14. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 14.1 [DP] Competitors who wish to keep SPVs at CYC must make prior arrangements with the CYC Dockmaster for use of the hoist, trailer storage and in-the-water berthing. See NoR 17 for Dockmaster contact information.
- 14.2 [DP] All SPVs shall carry and monitor a VHF radio capable of communicating on normal domestic and international channels.
- 14.3 The conduct of SPVs and support persons is governed by the SIs.

15. PRIZES

- 15.1 Health guidelines permitting, the awards ceremony will be held at CYC after racing.
- 15.2 Trophies will be awarded based on the number of entries.

16. RISK STATEMENT

Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
